Dr. Don Teater –

Dr. Teater is a family physician who has lived and worked in western North Carolina for the past 28 years. In 2004 he started a clinic to treat those addicted to opioids in his community. From 2013 to 2016, he worked as the Medical Advisor at the National Safety Council addressing the national epidemic of opioid abuse, addiction, and overdose. Dr. Teater was lead facilitator for the expert panel discussion during the development of the CDC Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain – United States 2016.
